SUBJECT: Public Works Monthly Operating Report- March 2022

KEY ACTIVITIES

STATUS

- **WWTP Facility** Effluent flows: 58.23 million gallons were treated during March. The highest Daily flow was 2.86 million gallons on the 3rd and the lowest flow was 1.38 million gallons on the 31st. The average flow was 1.88 million gallons. Total rainfall for March was 5.50 inches. 204.75 yards of bio solids were hauled off site by a customer in March.
- **WTP** Highest production day was 3,003,000 gallons on March 24, 2022.
- **Water System** Replaced 21 water meters. Installed 1 new meter with radio reader and replaced 1 radio reader. Replaced 1-meter box and repaired 3 water service lines.
- **Streets** Swept 130 curb miles and 15 cubic yards of material was collected. 60 cubic yards of sweeping material hauled off to Coffin Butte.
- **Parks** None for March 2022.
