

ORDINANCE NO. 800

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF STAYTON, OREGON, AMENDING CHAPTER 17.20.960 OF THE STAYTON MUNICIPAL CODE, SIGN ORDINANCE, AND REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES OR PORTIONS OF ORDINANCES INCONSISTENT HERewith AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the City of Stayton has adopted a Sign Ordinance, Ordinance No. 776, which is codified in the Stayton Municipal Code as Chapter 17.20.960 (Signs); and

WHEREAS, the City of Stayton City Council has determined that Chapter 17.20.960 of the Stayton Municipal Code as set out in Ordinance No. 776 must be modified in certain respects;

NOW, THEREFORE, the City of Stayton ordains as follows:

SECTION 1.: Stayton Municipal Code Section 17.20.960(5)(n) is hereby amended to read:

17.20.960.5 PROHIBITED SIGNS

The following permanent signs shall be prohibited:

- n. Any new or relocated off-premise sign, unless specifically allowed as a permitted sign in this sign code, and so long as the proposed sign (even though otherwise permitted) is not located along a state scenic byway within the City limits. It being the intent of this section that all off-premise signs of any type shall be prohibited along state scenic byways that are located within the City limits.

SECTION 2.: Stayton Municipal Code Section 17.20.960(12), definition "Off-Premise Sign" shall be amended to read:


17.20.960.12 DEFINITIONS

For the purposes of this chapter, terms, phrases, words, abbreviations, and their derivatives shall be construed as specified herein:


OFF-PREMISE SIGN: Any business identification sign which is located on a piece of property which is not the property occupied by the business.
