

ORDINANCE NO. 419


AN ORDINANCE REPEALING ORDINANCE NO. 199 OF THE CITY OF STAYTON.

THE CITY OF STAYTON DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Ordinance No. 199 of the City of Stayton, passed by the council January 3, 1928; approved by the Mayor January 4, 1928, and entitled "A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE TO LICENSE, TAX AND REGULATE PUBLIC BILLIARD ROOMS, AND POOL HALLS WITHIN THE TOWN OF STAYTON, OREGON, TO PRESCRIBE THE MANNER OF LICENSING SUCH ROOMS AND HALLS, TO PROVIDE FOR DECLARING SUCH BILLIARD ROOMS AND POOL HALLS TO BE A PUBLIC NUISANCE, AND TO PROVIDE FOR DECLARING ANY LICENSE THAT MAY HAVE BEEN GRANTED TO THE OWNER, MANAGER, OPERATOR OR AGENT OF ANY SUCH ROOM OR HALL TO BE REVOKED AND FORFEITED, PRESCRIBING THE MANNER OF DECLARING ANY SUCH LICENSE REVOKED, TO PROVIDE PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS OF THIS ORDINANCE, PROHIBITING MINORS FROM PLAYING GAMES OR REMAINING IN ANY SUCH ROOM OR HALL, AND TO DECLARE AN EMERGENCY TO EXIST, AND TO REPEAL CERTAIN ORDINANCES AND PARTS OF ORDINANCES" is hereby repealed.

PASSED by the council this 1st day of May, 1972.
