ORDINANCE NO. 149.

A Bill for an Ordinance to regulate the circulation and distribution of hand-bills, circulars, papers, magazines, and other printed or written matter within the town of Stayton, and declaring an emergency to exist.

THE TOWN OF STAYTON DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to circulate or distribute, or cause to be circulated or distributed within the town of Stayton, any hand-bills, circulars, papers, magazines or other printed or written matter without first securing a permit from the marshal of said town.

Section 2. The marshal is hereby authorized to issue permits to any person or persons applying therefor, for the purpose of circulating or distributing hand-bills, circulars, papers, magazines, or other printed or written matter within the town of Stayton, whenever in his judgment the same will not be derogatory to the best interests of said town.

Section 3. Any person or persons violating the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof, before the Recorder, shall be punished by a fine not exceeding the sum of \$100.00, or by imprisonment in the town jail not exceeding 50 days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Section 4. Whereas, heretofore certain persons have distributed printed matter of a questionable nature, from house to house in said town during the night time, and have disturbed the citizens of said town by walking upon their porches and otherwise making themselves obnoxious, it is the judgment of the Council that an emergency exists, and that this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the peace, health and safety of said town, and an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and that this ordinance shall become immediately operative and in full force and effect upon its passage by the Council and approval by the Mayor.
