ORDINANCE NO 165.

A BILL

For an Ordinance Granting unto Stayton Light and Power Company, Its Successors and assigns the right, privilege and Franchise to Construct, erect, maintain and operate Electric power transmission lines and other Electric light and power circuits, including all necessary poles, wires, Standards, equipment, appliances and apparatus over, across, upon and within any and all of the Streets, public roads, highways, alleys and public grounds within the corporate limits of the Town of Stayton, in Marion County, Oregon, for the purpose of supplying the inhabitants of said Town with Electricity for light, heat and power and all other purposes for which electricity is or may be used, together with the right and privilege of connecting any and all such transmission lines at the boundary of said town with other lines for the transmission of electricity to other places, and the right and privilege of constructing, maintaining, using and removing all necessary service and other wires, lines and appliances from the lines in said streets, roads, highways, alleys and public grounds into and upon private property adjacent thereto, for a period of Twenty-five years from the date this Ordinance is approved by the Mayor of the town of Stayton. X

THE TOWN OF STAYTON DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS;

Section 1. That Stayton Light and Power Company, a corporation, duly organized and existing under and by virtue of the laws of the State of Oregon, its successors and assigns, be and it and they are, hereby granted the right, privilege and franchise of constructing, erecting, maintaining and operating electric power transmission lines and other electric light, heat and power circuits, including all necessary poles wires, standards, equipment, appliances and apparatus over, across, upon and within any and all of the streets, public roads, highways, alleys and public grounds within the corporate limits of the Town of Stayton, in Marion County, Oregon, for the purpose of supplying the inhabitants of said Town of Stayton with electricity for light, heat and power and all other purposes for which electricity is or may be used, together with the right and privilege of constructing, erecting, maintaining, using and removing all necessary service and other wires, lines, and appliances from the lines of said streets, roads, highways, alleys and public grounds into and upon private property adjacent thereto. ✓

Section 2. That said Stayton Light and Power Company, its successors and assigns be and it and they are hereby granted the right, privilege and franchise of connecting at the boundary of said Town any or all of its said transmission lines with other lines for the transmission of electricity, for the purpose of supplying the inhabitants of other Towns and other communities in Marion County, Oregon, and in Linn County, Oregon, and in either or both of said counties with electricity for light, heat, power and other purposes.

Section 3. That the lines, poles and wires erected from time to time by said Stayton Light and Power Company, its successors and assigns, shall be installed pursuant to the general regulations governing overhead and under ground construction of lines for the transmission of electricity as promulgated by the public Service Commission of Oregon in force at the time of such erection and pursuant to regulations prescribed by said Town of Stayton, and said lines, poles and wires shall be placed so as to interfere as little as

possible with public travel on and use by the public of said streets, roads, highways, alleys and public grounds, and the placing of said poles shall at all times be subject to the supervision of said Town of Stayten, PROVIDED, however, that said Stayten Light and Power Company, its successors and assigns, shall not be compelled to place, erect, maintain or use such poles, wires, cables, ducts, appliances or other apparatus so as to interfere with or prevent said Stayten Light and Power Company, its successors and assigns from carrying on the business of furnishing electricity for any or all of the purposes herein above set forth.

Section 4. Whenever it becomes necessary in the operation, maintenance, use or removal of any such transmission lines or light or power circuits or any such poles, wires, cables, ducts, appliances or apparatus for said Stayten Light and Power Company, its successors or assigns, to dig into or in any manner interfere with or disturb any street, road, highway, alley or public ground within said town of Stayten, said Stayten Light and Power Company its successors and assigns, shall without delay and at its own expense restore such streets, roads, highways, alleys. or public grounds, as the case may be, to as good condition as before being so broken up, dug up or disturbed.

Section 5. That the rights, powers, privileges and franchise hereby granted shall enure for the period of twenty-five years from the date of the approval of this ordinance by the Mayor of said Town of Stayten, and said Stayten Light and Power Company shall, within thirty days from and after the approval of this ordinance by said Mayor, file with the Recorder of said Town of Stayten its written acceptance hereof. The rights, powers, privileges and franchise hereby granted shall be deemed additional to those now held and owned by the Stayten Light and Power Company under and by virtue of Ordinance Number 36 of said Town of Stayten, and said ordinance number 36 shall remain in full force and effect, pursuant to its terms and conditions.
