

ORDINANCE NO. 46.

A Bill for an Ordinance to provide the form of Poll Books and Official Ballots to be used at all Town elections held in the Town of Stayton, Marion County, Oregon, and the manner and time of placing the named of candidates for Town officers on such official ballots.

THE COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF STAYTON DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That all elections held in the Town of Stayton, for officers of said Town, shall be governed and conducted in the same manner as general state and county elections are governed and conducted and the judges of such election shall be governed by the general laws of the State of Oregon, in relation to state elections, in conducting the same, and shall have the same powers to preserve order at the polls as judges of state and county elections have.

Section 2. The following shall be the form of the Poll Book of the election held in the town of Stayton, Marion County, Oregon, on the _____ day of _____ 190

Section 4 ^R Any assembly of electors as hereinafter defined and individual electors to the number hereinafter specified by causing a certificate of nomination to be duly prepared and filed in the manner hereinafter specified, may nominate one candidate for each public office to be filled at any election whose name shall be put on the official ballot, as hereinafter provided. An assembly of electors within the meaning of this ordinance is an organized body of not less than twenty-five electors of the Town of Stayton, Marion County, Oregon.

Section 5 ^R Every such certificate of nomination made by such assembly may contain the name of one candidate for each office to be filled at the election; it shall state such facts as are required to be stated by this ordinance; it shall be signed by the presiding officer and secretary of such assembly by which it purports to be made, and an affidavit shall be made thereon, by such presiding officer and secretary to the effect that the statement therein are true.

Section 6. Every such certificate of nomination made by individual electors of a candidate for any office to be filled at such election shall be signed by not less than twelve electors of said town, each elector signing a certificate of nomination shall add to his signature his place of residence with the street and number thereof, if any and each of said electors shall subscribe to only one such certificate of nomination for each office to be filled at such election, at least two of the signers to each of such certificate of nomination shall make an affidavit and attach thereto to the effect that the statements and signatures therein are true and that the requisite number of signers thereon are qualified to make such nomination.

Section 7. All certificates of nomination shall state such facts as are required by this ordinance, and also the name of the candidate; the office for which he is nominated; the party or principle which he represents, expressed in not more than three words; his place of residence and street and number if any, and such certificate of nomination shall be accompanied by the acceptance of the nominee endorsed thereon, or attached thereto. Several different certificates of nomination may thus be filed nominating the same person for the same office, and the acceptance of one of said nominations is equivalent to the acceptance of all of said nominations for the same office, and unless such nominee accepts such nomination as a candidate for such office as herein provided, his name shall not be placed upon the ballot.

Section 8. Any person who has been nominated and accepted some nomination, as provided in this ordinance, may cause his name to be withdrawn from nomination at any time prior to the election by a writing, declining the nomination, stating the reason therefor, signed and acknowledged by him before some officer authorized to take acknowledgements of deeds and certified by such officer and filing the same with the Recorder and his name shall not be printed on the ballot, and if already printed, shall be erased or cancelled before the ballots are delivered to the electors.

Section 9. All certificates of nomination and acceptances of candidates for office to be filled by the electors of the Town of Stayton, shall be filed with the Recorder of said Town, not more than thirty days and not less than ten days before the day fixed by law and Ordinances for holding the same.

Section 10. Not more than six and not less than three days before the day fixed by law for the election, the recorder shall arrange all the names of the candidates in the certificates of nomination which have been filed with him and accepted by the nominees, and not withdrawn and cause to be printed the ballots according to law; the colored or sample ballots and the white or official ballots required by law and this Ordinance.

Section 11. All ballots designed to be voted shall be printed in black ink upon a good quality of white paper and shall be alike and the same size. Duplicate impressions of the same shall be printed upon a cheaper and colored paper so as to be readily distinguished from the white ballots which colored ballots shall be used solely as sample ballots for the information and convenience of voters and shall not be voted and if noted shall not be counted.

Section 12. The ballots shall be styled- Official Ballot, Town of Stayton, and the date of the election held when they are intended to be used and shall be arranged as near as practicable as the official ballots are arranged under the general Laws of Oregon, for state and county elections, and the said official ballots shall be substantially in the following form:
