

RESOLUTION NO. 202

Whereas, certain areas of the City of Stayton are subject to periodic flooding from streams or rivers, causing serious damages to properties within these areas; and

Whereas, relief is available in the form of Federally subsidized flood insurance is authorized by the National Flood Insurance Act of 1968; and

Whereas, it is the intent of the council to require the recognition and evaluation of flood hazards in all official actions relating to land use in the flood plain areas having special flood hazards; and

Whereas, this body has the legal authority to adopt land use and control measures to reduce future flood losses pursuant to ORS. 221.410;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that this council hereby:

Section 1. Assures the Federal Insurance Administration that it will enact as necessary, and maintain in force for those areas having flood hazards, adequate land use and control measures with effective enforcement provisions consistent with the Criteria set forth in Section 1910 of the National Flood Insurance Program Regulations; and

Section 2. Vests the City Engineer with the responsibility, authority, and means to:

- (a) Delineate or assist the Administrator, at his request, in delineating the limits of the areas having special flood hazards on available local maps of sufficient scale to identify the location of building sites.
- (b) Provide such information as the Administrator may request concerning present uses and occupancy of the flood plain area.
- (c) Cooperate with Federal, State, and local agencies and private firms which undertake to study, survey, map, and identify flood plain areas, and cooperate with neighboring communities with respect to management of adjoining flood plain areas in order to prevent aggravation of existing hazards.
- ~~(d)~~ Submit on the anniversary date of the community's initial eligibility on annual report to the Administrator on the progress made during the past year within the community in the development and implementation of the flood plain management measures.

Section 3. Appoints the City Engineer to maintain for public inspection and to furnish upon request a record of elevations (in relation to mean sea level) of the lowest floor (including basement) of all new or substantially improved structures located in the special flood hazard areas. If the lowest floor is below grade on one side or more the elevation of the floor immediately above must also be recorded.

Section 4. Agrees to take such other official action as may be reasonably necessary to carry out the objectives of the program.
