

RESOLUTION NUMBER 116

Ordering construction of a 5 foot curb sidewalk on the east side of First Avenue between Washington Street and the Salem Ditch and a 5 foot curb sidewalk on the west side of First Avenue between the Salem Ditch and a point 108 feet south of the south line of Washington Street.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF STAYTON, OREGON:

The Common Council hereby declares it to be necessary and expedient that a 5 foot curb sidewalk be constructed within the corporate limits of the City of Stayton, Oregon, upon and along the east side of First Avenue between Washington Street and the Salem Ditch and upon and along the west side of First Avenue between Washington Street and a point 108 feet south of the south line of Washington Street.

The 5 foot curb sidewalks ordered constructed by this resolution shall be built of Portland Cement Concrete as provided by Ordinance Number 300, and shall be laid down and constructed at the expense of the lot or parcel of land involved. Such 5 foot curb sidewalks shall be completed within 90 days after the engineering data is available. The recorder shall give notice by mail to the owner of said property requiring such owner to construct the said 5 foot curb sidewalk as herein ordered; and in case the address of the owner be unknown, the city engineer shall post such notice upon said property. Before constructing such 5 foot curb sidewalk, the owner of said premises or his agent, shall obtain plans and specifications from the city engineer, which shall prescribe the kind of 5 foot curb sidewalk to be constructed, the material to be used, and the specifications therefore.

In case the owner of the property shall fail to construct the 5 foot curb sidewalk as hereby ordered, and within the time limit above specified, the Common Council shall take steps to bring about the construction of such 5 foot curb sidewalks and make the cost thereof a lien upon the property involved.
