On October 1, 2012, the City Council approved a new annual sidewalk safety inspection program in Stayton. The purpose of the program is to identify safety hazards which may exist and to work with property owners to repair hazardous sidewalks.

The City has been divided into a total of eleven areas, and each year one area will be focused on. The first area to be inspected will be the older Downtown area



from First Avenue to Fourth Avenue, and Washington Street to Water Street.

#### Stayton's Annual Clean-Up Days

Fall leaves means it's time for the Stayton Annual Clean-Up Days. Remember, in Stayton, residents are responsible for all leaves and debris that fall on their property. Please do not place leaves or debris in the street as they can block drainage ways and cause flooding.

The City of Stayton is offering disposal of yard debris, including leaves and brush, on Saturday, November 10 from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. and Saturday, December 8 from 9 a.m. until 2 p.m. The collection site is at the City of Stayton Public Works Shops located at 1820 N. 1<sup>st</sup> Avenue, Stayton. The only cost to you is a donation of canned food to be given to the Stayton Food Bank.

Seniors who need assistance raking, bagging, or having their yard debris picked up and delivered to the drop-off site are asked to sign up by contacting Stayton Public Works at (503) 769-2919.

Clean-up Days are being offered by the City of Stayton in cooperation with Allied Waste, Stayton Food Bank, and the Marion County Solid Waste Department.

### Stayton Police Warn Parents of "Robo-Tripping"

Recently, the Stayton Police Department has responded to numerous reports of juveniles shoplifting cough syrup and cold medicines. There has been a recent trend of kids taking large amounts of Robitussin or Mucinex to gain a euphoric effect.

The street name for this activity is "Robo-Tripping", which is very dangerous and can result in death. Recently, one local juvenile had to have his chest opened to restart his heart due to this activity.



By using these drugs outside the recommended dosage, the chemicals can potentially slow or even shut-down certain neural pathways, which prevents areas of the brain from communicating with each other. This leaves the user feeling dissociated or potentially "out of body" and can cause the heart to stop beating.

If you have children or grandchildren, please explain the dangers of this behavior to them. Also, if you are in a store and see a group of juveniles congregating around the cold medicines, notify a store employee immediately. Store owners are encouraged to consider placing these items behind the counter or in a locked case.
