

the practice of professional and local government management, ICMA awards certificates each year to recognize cities that instill a culture of performance management, pursue comparative analysis and data-informed decision-making, and promote transparency.

Stayton's City Manager, Keith Campbell had the following comments about the honor, "This award is a reflection of the values and expectations of the City of Stayton Governing Body. We may not be a large City, but our community should expect the City of Stayton to be a benchmark for quality, transparency, and best practices. Tall Grass? Noxious Weeds? Low Hanging Branches?

Our Code Enforcement Officers would like to remind you as the weather continues to heat up, tall grass and noxious weeds can become fire dangers. Stayton residents are responsible for upkeep of their property which includes, but is not limited to, mowing grass and removing

Also on the radar of our Code Enforcement team are low hanging tree branches. Trees must be more than 10 feet above the street and 8 feet above the sidewalk to keep both drivers and pedestrians safe.

When our Code Enforcement team identifies a violation, they will make contact with the occupant of the property to ensure they are aware of the issue. If the issue is not remedied within a given period of

time, the City will hire a contractor to perform needed services to bring the property into compliance. The property owner will be charged a \$100 fine in addition to the expense of hiring the contractor.

Public Works Project Updates

The Public Works department recently completed an overlay of W. Regis Street between N. First Avenue and Gardner Avenue. The project included new ADA approved ramps, street trees, and water service upgrades.

The Slow Sand Filtration Project at the Water Treatment Plant was also recently completed with approximately 4,500 tons of new sand added to Filter Bed #1. Water from the North Santiam River is processed through the Sand Filter Bed and contaminants are removed before adding chlorine and being sent on to our community.

This summer, the City's sidewalk safety inspection area included W. Regis Street, W. Kathy Street, Gardner Avenue, Fern Avenue, N. Douglas Avenue, and Shaff Road. Sidewalks were inspected for hazardous or unsafe conditions and property owners were notified of damaged areas requiring repair. The project is scheduled to wrap up in July.

Additionally, nine streets in the Sylvan Springs neighborhood were crack sealed in June and a slurry seal will be applied this summer. Residents effected will be notified of the project timeline.
