

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING AND LICENSING THE BUSINESS OF SELLING GOODS, WARES AND MERCHANDISE BY TRANSIENT OR ITINERANT MERCHANTS; DEFINING WHAT SHALL CONSTITUTE A TRANSIENT OR ITINERANT MERCHANT; AND PROVIDING A PENALTY FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF.

The Town of Stayton do ordain as follows:

Section 1. The term "transient or itinerant merchant" shall be construed to mean and include all persons, their agents or representatives, who conduct within the limits of the town of Stayton a transient, or temporary business with the intention of selling or offering for sale, goods, wares or merchandise, at stated intervals or periodically, or of continuing such business in any one place within said town for a period of not more than 6 months.

Section 2. Before engaging in any business as a transient or itinerant merchant as set out in section 1 of this ordinance, a license shall be first obtained from the recorder, on payment of the following fees:

\$25 per day; \$50 per week; and \$100 per month, payable in advance.

Section 3. Anyone required to pay a license as set out in this ordinance who protests at the time the license is issued that he is not a transient or itinerant merchant as set out herein, and who shall remain in business at one place longer than 6 months shall be entitled to a return of all license fees paid.

Section 4. It is understood that the provisions of this ordinance do not apply to farmers of the state of Oregon selling, exchanging, or offering to sell or exchange their own goods, wares and merchandise raised or produced from their own premises.

Section 5. Any person convicted of a violation of this ordinance shall upon conviction thereof be fined a sum not less than \$25, or not more than \$100, together with costs of proceedings, which said fine may be satisfied, if not paid in cash, by execution against the person of anyone convicted of committing the misdemeanor herein prohibited.
