

ORDINANCE No. 138.

A Bill of an Ordinance making it unlawful for the owners of real property within the town of Stayton, Oregon, to allow or permit grass, weeds, berry bushes, briars, brush or rubbish to grow or remain in the Streets, Alleys or other Highways abutting upon their property to the center of such street, alley or highway; providing a penalty for violations of this ordinance; repealing Ordinances No. 69 and 123; and declaring an emergency to exist.

THE TOWN OF STAYTON DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for the owners of any real property within the town of Stayton, Oregon, to permit or allow any grass, weeds, berry bushes, briars, brush or rubbish to grow or remain upon the street, alley or other highway abutting upon their property from the boundary line of such property to the center of such street, alley or other highway.

Section 2. Any person violating the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof in the Recorder's Court shall be fined in a sum not exceeding \$20.00.

Section 3. All of Ordinances No. 69 and 123, be and the same are hereby repealed.

Section 4. Whereas the provisions of this ordinance are designed for the protection of the traveling public from annoyance from obnoxious grass, weeds and brush along the streets and sidewalks of the town and also to prevent fires, it is the judgment of the Council that an emergency exists, and that this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the peace, health and safety of the town, and that it shall become immediately operative upon its passage by the Council and approval by the Mayor.
