

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 475 OF THE
CITY OF STAYTON

THE CITY OF STAYTON ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:

Ordinance No. 475 of the City of Stayton, entitled "AN ORDINANCE CONTROLLING VEHICULAR AND PEDESTRIAN TRAFFIC; PROVIDING PENALTIES; AND REPEALING ORDINANCES" enacted the 21st day of December, 1976, is hereby amended with the addition of the following:


Parking Regulations, Section 21

3. No person owning or controlling any commercial truck, as defined in ORS 483.014 shall permit it to be parked or maintained on any public street in any area of the city zoned for residential use for a period of time exceeding two (2) hours. Any motor truck as defined in ORS 483.014 must be parked legally and in the direction of proper flow of traffic and within 12 inches of a curb or a presumed curbline or sidewalk notwithstanding the provisions of this section, truck actually being used to load or unload cargo.
4. Repositioning of the truck from one parked position to another parked position on either side of the street within the same block, and within a thirty minute period shall not be treated as interrupting the continuity of the time said truck has been parked for the purpose of this ordinance.
5. It shall be unlawful for any person owning or having the care or control of any pickup camper not mounted on a licensed motor vehicle or any motor home, travel trailer, motor boat

or utility trailer to park said vehicle on a public street or alley for the purpose of storage. For the purpose of this section any vehicle described herein parked at the same location for a period of 24 hours shall be considered stored.


