RESOLUTION OF THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF STAYTON, OREGON

Be it remembered that at a meeting of the Common Council of the Town of Stayton, Oregon held on the ___ day of _____, 1952 the following action was taken.

In the Matter of the Constructing of a Sidewalk on the North side of Locust Street in the Town of Stayton, Marion County, Oregon.

RESOLVED, that whereas the Common Council of the Town of Stayton has deemed it expedient and necessary that a sidewalk be constructed on the North side of Locust Street in order to preserve and protect and for a safety measure establish a walking area for the students of the Union High School together with the betterment of the property and improvement of pedestrain conditions, and

WHEREAS said Common Council of the Town of Stayton has established that said sidewalk should be constructed on the following description, to-wit:

Beginning on the North line of Locust Street in the City of Stayton, at a point where said North line intersects the line which divides the Southwest 1/4 of the of the Northwest 1/4 of Section 10, Township 9 South, Range 1 West of the Willamette Meridian, Marion County Oregon, into East and West Halves; thence East 1962.89 feet to the West line of First Street; thence South along said West line on First Street 6.00 feet; thence West 1962.89 feet to a point which is South of the point of beginning, thence North 6.00 feet to the place of beginning.

WHEREAS said sidewalk shall be constructed of cement and that said sidewalk shall be constructed by August 1, 1952, and that such said expense of said construction of said sidewalk shall be at the expense of the adjacent and abutting property owners, to-wit: Union High School District No. 4, Marion-Linn County, Oregon; Dora Dozler Marking and Gerald Marking; Raymond D. Kerber and Marjorie E. Kerber; Frank Shinkle and Amanda Shinkle; and Anna Barkmeyer Wyman.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF STAYTON, OREGON

Section 1. That a six (6) foot in width sidewalk, to be constructed of cement materials, not less than four inches in thickness consisting of a mixture of concrete and cement to the acceptable standards for mixture

for base and for sidewalk topping at a grade elevation of 2 inches above the crown of Locust Street and shall be constructed on the following described real property, to-wit:

Beginning on the North line of Locust Street in the City of Stayton, at a point where said North line intersects the line which divides the Southwest 1/4 of the Northwest 1/4 of Section 10, Township 9 South, Range 1 West of the Willamette Meridian, Marion County, Oregon, into East and West halves; thence East 1962.89 feet to the West line of First Street; thence South along said West line of First Street 6.00 feet; thence West 1962.89 feet to a point which is South of the point of beginning, thence North 6.00 feet to the place of beginning.

Section 2. That the City Recorder is directed to give notice of the construction of said sidewalk to the abutting property owners against whom the expense and constructing costs of said sidewalk shall be assessed, to-wit: Union High School District No. 4, Marion-Linn County, Oregon; Dora Dozler Marking and Gerald Marking; Raymond D. Kerber and Marjorie E. Kerber; Frank Shinkle and Amanda Shinkle and Anna Barkmeyer Wyman, and that said notice shall specify and direct said property owners to construct said sidewalk on or before August 1, 1952, and in the event that they fail to do so the Town of Stayton shall construct said sidewalk on the property described above and shall record liens and assessments to be entered in the docket of Town liens and the same shall become a lien upon each lot or part thereof or parcel of land liable for the cost of construction of said walk.

Section 3. That construction costs of said sidewalk are to be assessed against the abutting and adjacent property owners in the manner and procedure as indicated above herein.

Section 4. That notice of said sidewalk construction shall be given by the City Recorder to the persons hereinabove listed by service of a duly certified copy of said notice to be served upon the individual property owners by the Marshall of the Town of Stayton.

That Whereas the Common Council of the Town of Stayton has deemed it expediant and necessary that a sidewalk be constructed on the North side of Locust Street in order to preserve and protect and for a safety measure establish a walking area for the students of the Union High School together with the betterment of the property and improvement of pedestrain conditions, and

Whereas said Common Council of the Town of Stayton has established that said sidewalk should be constructed, you are hereby notified to, within 10 days and by August 1, 1952, construct a sidewalk on your property adjacent to Locust Street and described as follows, to-wit:


Beginning on the North line of Locust Street in the City of Stayton, at a point where said North line intersects the line which divides the Southwest 1/4 of the Northwest 1/4 of Section 10, Township 9 South, Range 1 West of the Willamette Meridian, Marion County, Oregon, into East and West Halves; thence East 1962.89 feet to the West line of First Street; thence South along said West line on First Street 4.00 feet; thence West 1962.89 feet to a point which is South of the point of beginning, thence North 4.00 feet to the place of beginning.

Said construction to be at the expense of the abutting property owner and if not so constructed by said property owner within the time specified above, or if said property owner does not desire to construct the sidewalk then the Town of Stayton shall construct the sidewalk and charge and assess the abutting property owner his proportionate share.

Said sidewalk to be constructed as follows, to-wit:

That a six (6) foot in width sidewalk, to be constructed of cement materials, not less than four inches in thickness consisting of a mixture of concrete and cement to the acceptable standards for mixture for base and for sidewalk topping at a grade elevation of 2 inches above the crown of Locust Street and shall be constructed on the within described property.
