Have You Met Dallas Yet?

In case you haven't been introduced yet, the Stayton Police Department has a new K9 companion! "Dallas" actually first became a part of our City family in April 2016, but we wanted to ensure he was compatible with our community and department before we formally announced his arrival. Let us assure you... Dallas is a keeper!



Dallas is a four odor (marijuana, methamphetamine, heroin, and cocaine) drug detection K9 who is four years old. He was previously with the University of Arizona Police Department. During his time at the agency, he developed an injury to his front right leg, which prohibited him from continuing his duties as a drug detection K9. He was returned to Pacific Coast K9 before making his journey home to Stayton where he would find a new calling.

In April, Detective Eves and Lieutenant Button attended an annual K9 conference and certification course with current Stayton Police narcotic detection K9 Brodie. At the conference, they were able to network with the owner of Pacific Coast K9, the same company from which the City purchased Brodie. After hearing about Dallas and a brief negotiation, Pacific Coast K9 fully donated Dallas to the City of Stayton. The City incurred no expense and we are so grateful to Pacific Coast K9 for their generosity. A Stayton Police Department officer has volunteered to take care of all future expenses.



The Stayton Police Department intends to utilize Dallas in local schools to help strengthen the relationship between the Police Department and local youth. Dallas has already proven himself in numerous circumstances by helping children feel more comfortable in difficult situations. His lovable, approachable personality is simply irreplaceable, and we feel very fortunate to have him!

New Local Commercial Projects



The City has issued or is about to issue building permits for two new commercial structures. MAPS Credit Union will be constructing a 6,000 square foot building to house a new office and retailing banking center for the credit union and have commercial rental space at the corner of Fern Ridge Road and Cascade Highway. The credit union facility will be approximately 3,500 square feet in area and will include a drive-thru window on the north side. The commercial rental space will be approximately 2,500 square feet in area. As part of the project, a sidewalk will be constructed along the Fern Ridge Road frontage of the property. An artist's rendering of the new building is shown above.

Stayton Veterinary Hospital is also constructing a new building to replace their existing facility at 1380 N. First Avenue. The new clinic building will be located behind the existing building at the corner of N. Second Avenue and E. Hollister Street. Once the new building is completed, the existing clinic building will be demolished and replaced with an expanded parking area. The project will include new sidewalks and street improvements on N. Second Avenue and E. Hollister Street.

Public Viewing of Property

On September 17, 2016 from 12:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m., the Stayton Police Department will provide a viewing of property that has been recovered as a result of numerous thefts occurring in Stayton, and the surrounding areas of Marion and Linn counties. The property viewing will be held at the City of Stayton Public Works Shops located at 1820 N. 1st Avenue.

To view the property you MUST have a police report listing your property with a brief description of what was lost or stolen. You must also have a valid picture ID. Once you provide this, you will be allowed to view the property. No one will be allowed to view property without a police report.

If you find an item that you believe belongs to you, the Detective or Officer will compare the property with the police report. Please be aware that there are multiple items that are similar, so if you have pictures available or serial numbers, please bring them. The more information you can provide, the better possibility of retrieving your property.
