- b. Councilor Usselman would like to see acquisition of the long horn property; wheel chair accessibility in regard to City sidewalks and curbs.
- c. Councilor Lewis would like to see E. Virginia Street paved curb to curb; the construction of a skate park; acquisition of the long horn property; and economic development especially in the industrial area.
- d. Councilor Niegel would like to see continued improvements to streets and sidewalks; completion of the Pioneer Park improvements project; and funding for storm water improvements.
- e. Councilor Quigley would like to see continue improvements to streets; and economic development in the industrial area.

**GOAL SETTING**

The Council were given sticky notes and directed to list their goals on them and attach them to the corresponding category that was hung on large sheets of paper around the room.

- Land Use
  - To encourage infill to increase available housing
  - To review, improve, and streamline City plans, ordinances, and polices to reduce barriers.
- Transportation / Streets
  - To develop a long-term transportation plan to include targeting streets and funding sources.
  - To increase public transportation availability.
  - To improve the sidewalk system within the city, including wheel chair accessibility.
- Public Safety
  - To reduce liability risk for public safety through use of technology.
  - To develop & implement policies to address legalized marijuana.
- Public Utilities / Public Facilities
  - To create a city infrastructure maintenance program to preserve city water, sewer, storm water, streets,

and parks.

- To develop a long-term plan for a centralized city hall.
- To create a 5 year CIP for city infrastructure.
- To preserve and improve City water, sewer, storm, streets, parks, and facilities.
- Finance / Administration
  - To encourage sound fiscal planning and budgeting.
- Intergovernmental Relations / Regional Partnerships
  - Reestablish relationship with City of Sublimity.
- Citizen Communication / Participation
  - To increase the City's reach to citizens through new avenues.
- Parks and Recreation
  - To continuously maintain and improve the parks system.

  - Explore creation of an urban renewal district.
