SUBJECT: Public Works Monthly Operating Report- January 2019

KEY ACTIVITIES STATUS

- WWTP Facility Effluent flows: 52.66 million gallons were treated during January. The highest Daily flow was 2.15 million gallons on the 22nd and the lowest flow was 1.37 million gallons on the 16th. The average flow was 1.7 million gallons. Total rainfall for January was 3.20 inches. No bio solids were hauled off site in January.
- WTP Highest production day was 1,753,000 gallons on January 9, 2019.
- Water System Installed a water meter for irrigation at Neitling Park. This was the last park that needed a water meter for irrigation. Replaced 5 water meters. Repaired a fire hydrant at Fourth and Florence, and replaced a water meter box on Peach Ave.
- Streets Swept 84 miles of curb and collected 21 cubic yards of material. Applied 450 pounds of cold patch. Removed 4 cubic yards of brush that was on the streets from wind storm early in the month. Replaced "Bump" signs on Washington St. Replaced "No Outlet" at Sixth and Regis.
- Parks Volunteers: Community Service: Total # of Volunteers = 3, Total # of hours = 96 Parks Board: Total # of Volunteers = 3, Total # of hours = 1.50
