SUBJECT: Public Works Monthly Operating Report- July 2020

## KEY ACTIVITIES STATUS

• WWTP Facility Effluent flows: 34.82 million gallons were treated during July. The highest Daily

flow was 1.40 million gallons on July  $2^{nd}$  and the lowest flow was 0.93 million gallons on the July  $5^{th}$  &  $19^{th}$ . The average flow was 1.12 million gallons. Total rainfall for July was 0.00 inches. 23.66 dry tons of bio solids were produced. 47.0 yards of bio solids were used for lawn fertilizer at the WWTP and 5.2 yards

of Santiam Green was picked up by local citizens in July.

WTP Highest production day was 3,149,000 gallons on July 11<sup>th</sup>.

Water System Replaced 8 water meters. Installed one new meter and radio reader. Replaced

two meter boxes, one new meter stop. Water service replacement at 1536 3<sup>rd</sup>

Ave. Cleaned #2 sand filter bed.

Streets Swept 143 curb miles and 26 cubic yards of material was collected. 420 lbs. of

cold mix and 1 yard of gravel were applied to street potholes and street cutouts.

Replaced two stop signs.
