SUBJECT:	Public Works Monthly Operating Report- June 2022

## KEY ACTIVITIES STATUS

- WWTP Facility Effluent flows: 50.04 million gallons were treated during June. The highest Daily flow was 2.72 million gallons on the 14th and the lowest flow was 1.18 million gallons on the 26<sup>th</sup>. The average flow was 1.67 million gallons. Total rainfall for June was 4.03 inches. 47.5 Yards of bio solids were hauled off site in June.
- WTP Highest production day was 3,335,000 gallons on June 4, 2022. Slow Sand Filter Bed 2 was resanded and the project is 97% complete.
- Water System Repaired 2 meters. Replaced 1 meter box and 1 service line. Repaired 1 water main.
- Streets Swept 135 curb miles and 22 cubic yards of material was collected. 20 cubic yards of sweeping material hauled off to Coffin Butte.
- Parks None for May 2022.
