SUBJECT: Public Works Monthly Operating Report- November 2023

KEY ACTIVITIES STATUS

- WWTP Facility Effluent flows: 49.2 million gallons were treated during November. The highest Daily flow was 2.57 million gallons on the 7th and the lowest flow was 1.17 million gallons on the 3rd. The average flow was 1.64 million gallons. Total rainfall for November was 6.64 inches. No bio solids were hauled off site in November.
- WTP Highest production day was 3,197,000 gallons on November 1, 2023.
- Water System Replaced 4 meters. Replaced 1 meter box and replaced 1 meter stop.
- Streets Swept 70 curb miles. 7 yards of gravel applied to gravel roads. Received 65 cubic yards of debris from Fall Clean-up and took in 177 lbs of donated food for the Stayton Community Food Bank.
- Parks Parks Board: Total # of volunteers = 6, Total # of hours = 6
