KEY ACTIVITIES STATUS

- WWTP Facility Effluent flows: 56.13 million gallons were treated during March. The highest flow was 2.92 million gallons on the 25th and the lowest flow was 1.31 million gallons on the 21st. The average flow was 1.81 million gallons. Total rainfall for February was 4.36 inches.
- WTP Highest production day was 1,866,000 gallons on March 20, 2018.
- Water System Replaced 6 meters. Installed 3 new meters with radio readers. Repaired a meter stop on Wyatt. Notified several users of high usage. Repaired the water service to the Library. Cleaned #1 filter bed. Fire hydrant repaired on Westown Dr.
- Streets Swept 240 curb miles and collected 85 cubic yards of material. Replaced street signs on Tenth and Gardner to the new standards. Used 2,580 pounds of cold patch mix to fill potholes.
