## KEY ACTIVITIES STATUS

- WWTP Facility Effluent flows: 31.95 million gallons were treated during November. The highest Daily flow was 1.57 million gallons on the 28th and the lowest flow was 0.94 million gallons on the 17<sup>th</sup> and the 26<sup>th</sup>. The average flow was 0.94 million gallons. Total rainfall for November was 4.66 inches. No bio solids were hauled off site in November.
- WTP Highest production day was 2,970,000 gallons on November 7, 2018.
- Water System Replaced 9 meters. Cleaned the intake at the power canal while water level was low. Cleaned Filter Bed #3. Notified 2 users of high usage.
- Streets Swept 336 curb miles and collected 840 cubic yards of material. 1 new street name sign was installed to bring up to standard and reflectivity. 6 regulatory signs were replaced. Collected 60 cubic yards of yard debris at the City Shops from the Fall Leaf Clean Up. 157 pounds of non-perishable food was collected along with \$36.00 cash to be donated to the Stayton Community Food Bank.
