SUBJECT: November Library report

In November, thirty-six crafters of all ages tied fleece blankets and toys for animals at the Oregon Humane Society. The program was designed to provide an opportunity for children to craft with their grown-ups and to include teens and adults crafting independently. All Library staff helped facilitate a Yarn Swap where people of all ages swapped yarn, learned some simple patterns and techniques, and got inspired for their next project.

Rachel hosted a Dungeons & Dragons session for teens and adults. Evie facilitated a teen meetup and volunteer opportunity. Children unleashed their inner builder at our LEGO Build It program over several afternoons and also learned some new board games. Adults met for Book Club with Stephanie to discuss Killers of the Flower Moon: The Osage Murders and the Birth of the FBI by David Grann. Adults and teens joined Stephanie, Shelby, and Janna for our DIY Craftshop to make rustic book page wreaths, and Jennifer modified the activity so children could also participate.

All-Star Preschool brought one of their classes to the Library on a field trip. Jennifer, Evie, and Janna provided stories and tours. Jennifer and Evie opened the Reader's Café, and children and family members joined them to "taste" some children's titles, explore new book options and take home a book of their choice to add to their personal library. Janna ran the CCRLS Polk, Yamhill and Marion County Library Directors meeting and attended the CCRLS Advisory Council meeting as the PYM Chair, and Evie represented us at the PYM Circulation Committee meeting.
