SUBJECT:	April Library report

In April, we celebrated National Library Week, highlighting the essential role libraries, librarians, and library workers play in transforming lives and strengthening communities by offering opportunities to connect with media, programs, and ideas, in addition to books. Most importantly, libraries connect communities to each other.

The Library kicked off April with an April Foolery Egg Hunt. People of all ages looked for our silly eggs throughout the Library and, instead of yolks, found some jokes to share with Library staff members for a piece of candy. Children built bug hotels with their take & make kits. Teens created felt bird bookmarks, and adults made felt and hardware beehives.

Jennifer and Nicole presented a special Spring Storytime at the Stayton Community Garden. Bob Parsons from the Stayton Public Works Department brought a tractor for the children to explore. The Marion Polk Food Share provided seeds and pots for a planting project, and children also received a free book to keep.

Stephanie added three Citizen Science Kits to our Library of Things collection that features specialized tools to encourage and engage people to become active participants in scientific research. Community members can check out kits to document and identify plants and animals around them, identify and count pollinators as they visit flowering plants and measure and gather light pollution data.

Thanks to a generous grant from the Doris J. Wipper Fund of the Oregon Community Foundation, the Stayton Public Library Foundation was able to add Sublimity to our Dolly Parton Imagination Library coverage area. This program sends a free book each month to children ages 0-5 living in Stayton, Sublimity, Gates, Mehama, Detroit, and Idanha. Upcoming events:
