SUBJECT: December Library report

In December, fifty people joined Jennifer and Nicole for a special winter-themed storytime at Hiatt Christmas Tree Farm in Sublimity. Stephanie and Evie provided program support and hot chocolate to all participants. We gave away a free book to all children at the event thanks to funding from the Abigail Scott Duniway Chapter of the DAR and the Stayton Friends of the Library. Thank you to Brent Hiatt for partnering with us and helping us make this special event possible. Evie hosted our Holiday Party, and all Library staff helped celebrate our volunteers, Friends of the Library, Library Board, and Library Foundation board members. We also thanked our teen volunteers on a Saturday with donuts and holiday treats.

Jennifer read stories at Stayton Elementary School's caroling event, and Nicole provided program support. We gave away free books to all children at the event thanks to funding from the Stayton Friends of the Library. One hundred and thirty people joined us to decorate gingerbread cookies. Children created game board mazes and practiced their coding skills at our drop-in Maker Lab. Rachel hosted a Dungeons and Dragons game for first-timers or experienced players ages 12 and up, and the adult book club met with Stephanie to discuss *Eight Perfect Murders* by Peter Swanson. Adults and teens made gnome ornaments. Rachel presented family-friendly ghost stories, cookies, and cocoa at our Spirits of Christmas: Victorian Ghost Stories program.

People of all ages made lanterns and joined us outside for a Winter Solstice Lantern walk along a lighted path around Community Center Park. Thank you to Korin, Josie, Alissa, Lynsie, Chief Johns, Sergeant Butler, Ofc Leonard, Ofc Munoz, and Ofc Pindell for helping us set up and light luminary bags along the path in the park. The community helped us create a Holiday Lights Map highlighting houses and neighborhoods lit for the season. It was accessed over 200 times on festive drives to enjoy the lights.

Jennifer represented Stayton at the Oregon Library Association Children's Services Division meeting and the Polk, Yamhill and Marion counties (PYM) Children's Services meeting. Janna presented at the PYM Children's meeting about a CCRLS electronic resource project she is working on with the Library Director in Newberg and CCRLS staff.
