West Ida Street Sewer Replacement Project

The City of Stayton will be replacing an undersized sanitary sewer pipe in W. Ida Street from Jetters Way to near 1207 W. Ida Street. The project was put out to bid in late December 2022 and the City entered into a contract with Black Pearl Paving and Excavation in January 2023 to perform the sewer replacement project.



The project will include the installation of a new 30-inch sanitary sewer pipe and new sewer service laterals. A detailed construction schedule has not been established yet. The work will require ground water removal activities before the excavation and installation of the new sewer pipe can begin. It is anticipated the dewatering work will begin in April, with pipe installation beginning in May or June. The project is expected to be completed by September 1, 2023.

During the construction period, traffic will experience delays while traveling on Ida Street. It is recommended that an alternate route be used to avoid potentially long delays on Ida Street due to construction. The project will be active Monday through Friday from 7:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. The roadway will be open to all traffic outside of the working hours.
