

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE RUNNING AT LARGE OF CERTAIN DOMESTIC FOWLS
AND FIXING A PENALTY FOR VIOLATION THEREOF.

The Town of Stayton do ordain as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for the owner of any chicken, turkey, goose, duck, or other poultry or domestic fowl to allow the same to be or run at large within the corporate limits of the town of Stayton, ~~between the first day of March and 15th day of October of each year.~~

Section 2. For the first offense it shall be the duty of the marshal to notify the owner of such chicken, turkey, goose, duck, or other poultry or domestic fowl running at large, and to warn such owner to keep such domestic fowl within enclosures, or be subject to the penalty provided in this ordinance.

Section 3. Any person, being the owner of any domestic fowl mentioned in section 1 of this ordinance, who shall permit the same to run at large, after being notified by the marshal as provided in section 2 of this ordinance, shall be deemed guilty of an offense and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$2 nor more than \$20, or by imprisonment in the town jail for a term of not less than one day nor more than 10 days, or by both such fine and imprisonment in the discretion of the court; provided, that each and every day during which such person shall permit such domestic fowl to run at large shall be deemed to be a separate and distinct offense.
