ORDINANCE NO. 278

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE ANNEXATION OF REAL PROPERTY TO AND EXTENDING THE CITY LIMITS OF THE TOWN OF STAYTON AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF STAYTON Section 1. That whereas a petition was filed by all the property owners of the hereinafter described and bounded property. That pursuant to said petition and in compliance with Chapter 563 Oregon Laws 1951, the Common Councilof the Town of Stayton, by resolution, passed January 7, 1952, set a date for hearing of objections to said petition and annexation for February 4, 1952. That notice of said hearing stating time and place were published in the Stayton Mail, a newspaper of general circulation in said town, and four copies of said

There being no objections offered at or on the date of hearing, the Common Council of the Town of Stayton found that such annexation was necessary and directed the City Recorder to prepare an Ordinance annexing the property set forth in the petition to the Town of Stayton and extending the City limits to so include the same.

City Bulletin Board at the City Hall, Town of Stayton, Oregon.

Section 2. That it is hereby declared that the following described real property is hereby annexed to the Town of Stayton and the City Limits of the Town are hereby extended to include the same.

Beginning at a point which is the Quarter Section Stone on Highway 222, Section 11, Township 9 South, Range 1 West of W.M., Marion County, Oregon; thence running South 651 feet and 4 inches to a point which is the Northwest corner of a tract of land owned by Everett Ward and Tillie Ward, husband and wife, which said point is a true point of beginning and thence running East 1320 feet; thence South 80 feet; thence West 1320 feet; thence North 80 feet to the point of beginning, all in Marion County, Oregon

Section 3. That it is necessary that this property be added to the Town of Stayton for fire protection and water service and an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this ordinance shall be and become effective immediately upon its passage and adoption by the Common Council of the Town of Stayton and approval by the Mayor.
