

ORDINANCE NO. ²⁸¹~~278~~

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE VACATION OF DULY DEDICATED STREETS AND ALLEYS DESCRIBED HEREIN IN THE TOWN OF STAYTON MARION COUNTY, OREGON.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF STAYTON

Section 1. That Whereas the Common Council of the Town of Stayton did on the 2nd day of March, by resolution, propose the vacation of streets and alleys as hereinafter described and that whereas said resolution did specify and call for a hearing to be held in the City Hall of the Town of Stayton, Marion County, Oregon on the 6th day of April, 1953 at 8 o'clock P. M. Pursuant to said Resolution notices were posted at both ends of the proposed vacation and said notices were published four consecutive times in the Stayton Mail, a newspaper of general circulation, published in Stayton, Marion County, Oregon, stating the time, place and date of said hearing.

Whereas, said hearing was held on April 6th, 1953 and there were no objections or remonstrances and whereas the Common Council of the Town of Stayton, Marion County, Oregon, directed the City Recorder to prepare and draft an Ordinance vacating the hereinafter described real property.

Section 2. It is hereby declared that the following described real property, streets and alleys are hereby vacated, to-wit:

Beginning at a point 100.00 feet West of the Northeast corner of Block Three (3) in Ottomar Luttich's Addition to the Town of Stayton, Marion County, Oregon; thence South 167.5 feet; thence in a Northwesterly direction to a point which is 162.9 feet South and 16.00 feet West of the point of beginning; thence North 162.9 feet; thence East 16.00 feet to the point of beginning, acquired by Paul Fehlen and Anna Fehlen, his wife, through deed recorded October 20, 1925, in Volume 183, Page 399, Deed Records for Marion County, Oregon.
