ORDINANCE NO. 290

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE FLUORIDATION OF THE STAYTON MUNICIPAL WATER SUPPLY; SUBMITTING SUCH ORDINANCE TO THE REGISTERED VOTERS OF THE TOWN OF STAYTON FOR THEIR APPROVAL OR REJECTION AT A SPECIAL ELECTION TO BE HELD MAY 18, 1956; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

Be it Ordained by the Common Council of the Town of Stayton:

Section 1. That the Common Council and the Water Commissioner are hereby authorized and directed to provide the means for and proceed with the addition of appropriate amounts of fluorides compatible with good health to the municipal water supply of the Town of Stayton. The method of distribution of fluorides and the equipment used for such purpose shall meet the regulations of the Oregon State Board of Health.

Section 2. This ordinance is submitted to the registered voters of the Town of Stayton for their approval or rejection at a special election to be held May 18, 1956.

Section 3. The city attorney hereby is directed to prepare the necessary ballot title under which this ordinance shall be submitted to the registered voters of said city, and the recorder is hereby directed to cause the ballot title to be printed in proper form on the ballot to be used at the said special election and to perform all other acts necessary to properly submit said ordinance to the electors.

Section 4. That it hereby is adjudged and declared that existing conditions in the Town of Stayton are such that this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of public peace, health and safety; and an emergency hereby is declared to exist, and this ordinance shall take effect and be in full force and effect from and after its passage.
