An Ordinance vacating West Washington Street between Gardner and Evergreen Avenues in the City of Stayton, Oregon.

WHEREAS, that portion of West Washington Street between Gardner Avenue and Evergreen Avenue having been relocated by the Stayton Canning Company Cooperative, is no longer being used as a public street, and

WHEREAS, no objections have been presented at the public hearing or otherwise regarding such vacation, now therefore,

THE CITY OF STAYTON DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That portion of West Washington Street between Gardner Avenue and Evergreen Avenue, in the City of Stayton, Oregon, more particularly described as follows, to-wit:

A tract of land in Section 10, Township 9 South, Range 1 West, of the Willamette Meridian, Marion County, Oregon, 25 feet on either side of the centerline described as follows:

Beginning at a point in the center of Washington Street which is also Engineers centerline Station P.T. 4+22.37 of Market Road No. 32, said point being South 0° 02' 30" East 454.74 feet and South 77° 58' 30" West 195.50 feet and South 87° 20' 45" East 106.03 feet from the quarter section corner between Sections 9 and 10 of Township 9 South, Range 1 West of the Willamette Meridian in Marion County, Oregon, thence South 80° 27' East 86.54 feet to an iron pipe; thence South 79° 16' East 848.58 feet; thence North 89° 17' 30" East 269.10 feet; thence North 89° 41' 30" East 220.17 feet to a point in the center of Washington Street which is on the Southerly extension of the West line of land conveyed to D.G. Robl as recorded in Marion County Deed Records, Volume 593, Page 275, and there terminating.

Save and except that portion lying within Washington Street as relocated and described as follows:

Beginning at an iron pipe on the centerline of Washington Street which is also engineer's centerline station P.T. 169 + 41.21 of Market Road No. 32 survey, said point being South 0° 02' 30" East 454.74 feet and South 77° 58' 30" West 513.00 feet from the quarter  $(\frac{1}{4})$  section corner between sections 9 and 10 of Township 9 South, Range 1 West of the Willamette Meridian in Marion County, Oregon; thence North 77° 58' 30" East 211.47 feet to the point of curve of a 823.18 foot radius curve to the right; thence Northeasterly along the arc thereof 210.90 feet to the point of tangent; thence South 87° 20' 45" East 632.84 feet to the point of curve of a 1250.40 foot radius curve to the right, the point of intersection of said curve being an iron pipe which is 60.00 feet 0° 06' 30" West and 83.96 feet South 69° 46' East from the Southeast corner of Block 4 of Forrette's Addition to Stayton as recorded in Record of Townplats Volume 16, Page 35 for Marion County; thence Southeast along the arc thereof 383.64 feet to the point of reverse curve of a 1066.97 foot radius curve to the left; thence Southeasterly along the arc thereof 382.53 feet to the point of tangent; thence North 89° 41' 30" East along the center of Washington Street 26.66 feet to a point and terminus which is on the Southerly extension of the West line of land conveyed to D.G. Robl as recorded in Marion County Deed Records, Volume 593, Page 275, said terminus being also South 0° 07' West 127.5 feet from the Southwest corner of Lot 8, Block 1 of Fery's Addition to Stayton as recorded in Marion County Townplats, Volume 16, Page 17.

Length is 1848.04 feet or 0.350 miles. Width is 60 feet.

Section 2. That portion of West Washington Street between Gardner Avenue and Evergreen Avenue as described in Section 1 above shall be and hereby is vacated.

Section 3. It is hereby adjudged and declared that the existing conditions in the City of Stayton are such that this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, and an emergency hereby is declared to exist, and this ordinance shall take effect and be in full force and effect from and after its passage.
