

ORDINANCE NO. **377**

AN ORDINANCE levying a special property tax of \$25,000 per year outside the constitutional six percent limitation for a period of three years beginning with the fiscal year 1968-69 for the purpose of providing funds for the opening, repairing, and improving of city streets; submitting such ordinance to the legal voters of the City of Stayton for their approval or rejection at a city election; and declaring an emergency.

THE CITY OF STAYTON DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. For the purpose of providing funds for opening, repairing, improving, grading, widening, and paving streets within the City of Stayton, including related engineering, drainage, property acquisition, and curb and sidewalk costs, and for no other purpose, the Council each year for a period of three consecutive years, beginning with the fiscal year 1968-69, shall levy a special property tax of \$25,000 per year outside the limitation imposed by Article XI, Section 11, of the Constitution of the State of Oregon. The proceeds of said tax levies and such interest as may accrue thereon shall be set aside by the City Recorder in a "Street ^{IMPROVEMENT} Fund" separate and distinct from other funds of the city.

Section 2. As provided by ORS 280.080 the Council estimates that the total outlay for the purposes authorized by this ordinance, including legal and clerical expenses, engineering fees, and incidental costs will be the sum of \$75,000.

Section 3. This Ordinance is submitted to the legal voters of the City of Stayton for their approval or rejection at the state-wide primary election to be held between the hours of 8:00 o'clock a.m. and 8:00 o'clock p.m., Pacific Daylight Time, on May 28, 1968.

Section 4. The following ballot title prepared by the City Attorney under which this ordinance shall be submitted to the voters of the city, is hereby approved and adopted.

ORDINANCE REFERRED TO THE VOTERS BY THE CITY COUNCIL

Shall Ordinance No. **377** of the City of Stayton be adopted to authorize a tax levy by the City Council of \$25,000 per year outside the limitation imposed by Article XI, Section 11, of the State Constitution for three consecutive years beginning with the fiscal year 1968-69, to provide funds to open, repair, improve, grade, widen, and pave streets, including related engineering, drainage, property acquisition, and curb and sidewalk costs, and to pay all expenses incidental thereto, at an estimated aggregate cost from said levies of \$75,000.


Section 5. That the polling places and the election boards for the state-wide primary election held on May 28, 1968, shall be the polling places and election boards respectively for the said city and election, and the Recorder is hereby instructed to post and publish notices of the said election in the manner provided by Ordinance No. 242 of said city and furnish to the election boards for said election the necessary records, ballot boxes, tally sheets, and supplies for the said election.

Section 6. Said election shall be conducted in accordance with the election laws of the State of Oregon and with the Charter and Ordinances of the City of Stayton. The ballots cast at said election shall be counted, tabulated, and returned to the Recorder of said city. Upon approval by the voters of the said ordinance the Mayor shall issue his proclamation of the result of said election.

Section 7. It is hereby adjudged and declared that existing street conditions in the City of Stayton are such that this Ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the peace, health, safety, and general welfare of the city and the inhabitants thereof and an emergency hereby is declared to exist, and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval by the Mayor.


