ORDINANCE NO. 106.

A Bill for an Ordinance providing the mode of procedure for submitting Municipal measures to the people of the Town of Stayton, Oregon, by the Council of said Town.

THE TOWN OF STAYTON DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Whenever the Council of the Town of Stayton, Oregon, shall deem it expedient to submit to the legal voters of said Town any municipal measure or amendment to the Town Charter, such Council shall declare the same by Ordinance at least ten days before an election, at which such measure or amendment is to be voted upon, and no such measure or amendment shall become effective until it is approved by a majority of the votes cast by the legal voters of said Town at such election, or a greater number in instances so required by the Charter.

Section 2. Whenever any measure or amendment to the town Charter is proposed by the Council for submission to the legal voters, it shall be the duty of the Recorder to cause notices of election to be posted in three public places not later than ten days before said proposed election and said notices of election shall contain the full text of said proposed measure or amendment as the case may be, and said Recorder shall cause said notice of election and the full text of said measure or amendment as the case may be, to be published in the Stayton Mail at least five days before said election.

Section 3. Whenever the Council shall deem it expedient to submit to the legal voters of the Town of Stayton, Oregon, any municipal measure or amendment to the Town Charter, it may submit the same to be voted upon at either a special or general election and if such measure or amendment be submitted to be voted upon at a special election, and special election shall be called by the Council, by ordinance, at least ten days prior to the date set therefor.

Section 4. Inasmuch as the procedure herein provided for will be followed by important municipal measures, this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the peace, health and safety of the citizens of the Town of Stayton, Oregon, and an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage by the council of said Town and its approval by the Mayor.
