## ORDINANCE NO. 124.

A Bill for an Ordinance granting to the Stayton Co-operative Switchboard Association, its successors and assigns, the right to place, erect and maintain poles, wires and other appliances for the transmission of electricity, for telephone purposes in, upon and under the streets, alleys and public highways within the town of Stayton, Marion County, Oregon, and to exercise the privilege of operating telephone instruments within said Town of Stayton, Also declaring an emergency to exist and that this Ordinance shall become operative immediately upon its passage by the Council and approval by the Mayor.

## THE TOWN OF STAYTON DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Town of Stayton hereby grants to the Stayton Cooperative Switchboard Association, its successors and assigns a
perpetual franchise, right and privilege to place, erect, lay,
maintain and operate in the streets, alleys and public highways
within said town poles, wires and other appliances and conductors
for the transmission of electricity for telephone purposes; such
wires or other conductors may be strung upon poles or other fixtures
above the ground, or at the option of the grantee, its successors
or assigns; may be laid under ground in pipes, conduits, or otherwise protected, and such other appliances may be used as may be
necessary or proper to operate and maintain the same.

Section 2. It shall be lawful for the Stayton Co-operative Switch-board Association, its successors and assigns, to make all needful excavations in any of the streets, alleys and public highways in said town for the purpose of erecting and maintaining poles or other supports for said wires or other conductors, or for repairing the same, or for the purpose of laying down, maintaining and operating said wires or other conductors under ground or for repairing the same. Said work shall be done in compliance with all necessary and proper rules, regulations, ordinances or orders which may be adopted from time to time by said Town.

Section 3. WHEREAS, the Switchboard of the named Stayton Cooperative Switchboard Association, has recently moved to a new location, and WHEREAS, it is highly important that the various telephone lines connected with said switchboard be readjusted as soon as possible, in order to afford adequate fire protection and to properly serve the public in time of need, Now therefore, it is the judgment of the Council that an emergency exists, and that it is necessary for the immediate preservation of the peace, health and safety of the Town of Stayton, Oregon, that this ordinance become immediately operative upon its passage by the Council and approval by the Mayor.
