## ORDINANCE NO. 152.

A Bill for an Ordinance referring and submitting amendments to the Charter of the Town of Stayton, Oregon, as set out in Ordinances No. 150, and 151, to the legal voters of said town for their adoption or rejection at a special election to be held on the 24th day of June, 1918, and declaring an emergency to exist.

## THE TOWN OF STAYTON DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That a special election shall be held and is hereby called to be held in the town of Stayton, Oregon, on Monday, the 24th day of June, 1918, for the purpose of submitting to the legal voters of said town proposed charter amendments to the Charter of said town of Stayton, as set forth in Ordinances No. 150, and 151, for their adoption or rejection.

Section 2. That an amendment to Chapter II. of the Charter of the town of Stayton, Oregon, and to repeal Section 8, of Chapter VI. of said Charter as set forth in Ordinance No. 150, a copy of which said ordinance is hereunto attached, marked "Exhibit A", as made a part hereof, be and the same is hereby referred and submitted to the qualified electors of said town of Stayton, for their adoption or rejection at said special election.

That an amendment to Chapter IV. of the Charter of the town of Stayton, Oregon, as set forth in Ordinances No. 151, a copy of which is hereunto attached, marked "Exhibit B", and made a part hereof, be and the same is hereby referred and submitted to the qualified electors of said town for their adoption or rejection at said election.

Section 4. The recorder shall not later than tend days before said election cause notices of the same, with the full text of said proposed amendments, to be posted in three public places in said town of Stayton, and also cause said notice of election and the full text of said proposed amendments to be published in the Stayton Mail at least ten days before said election.

That whereas said proposed amendments to the Charter Section 5. of said town of Stayton, are necessary for the proper management of said town and for the protection of the people thereof, it is the judgment of the council that an emergency exists, and that this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the peace, health, and safety of the people of said town, and that this ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage by the council and approval by the mayor.
