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ORDINANCE NO? 187

A Bill for an Ordinance to fix water rates and to provide for the collection thereof, and to regulate the placing of Mains and service pipes and to regulate the placing of fixtures, and providing Penalties for violations of this ordinance, and to repeal all of Ordinance No 127, and all ordinances or parts of ordinances ^{in conflict} with this ordinance; and declaring an Emergency to exist.

THE TOWN OF STAYTON DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section, 1, That on and after the passage of this Ordinance the following rates shall be charged for the use of water from the Town Mains, to-wit;

A Minimum for any of the above connections will be \$1.00 per month with a charge of 25¢ for any additional connection listed above; and in all cases a Maximum for residences will be \$1.75 per month.

Section 2, Any person, firm or Corporation desiring to use water from the town Mains must make application to the Recorder in writing, which application must state the purpose for which the use of water is desired and the number of taps or faucets desired. When a permit has been granted for the use of water a pipe will be inserted in the Main, at the nearest or most convenient place, for a dwelling house the ^{tap} will be $\frac{3}{4}$ of an inch in diameter, and for other purposes said ~~pipe~~ shall be of such size as may be deemed sufficient to furnish the required amount of water, a service pipe shall be attached thereto and the trench dug and filled to the street curb nearest the premises

Section, 3, The charge for inserting a tap for any purpose shall be the entire cost of the work of tapping the main and of all cocks furnished; the pipe from the main to the curb shall be and remain the property of the Town of Stayton, and it shall be unlawful for any person unless authorized to do so to interfere therewith.

Section 4, Whenever it is desired by water users to discontinue the use of water for any purpose the pipe connecting with the faucet must be disconnected or stoped with a metallic plug or cap, all faucets or hose connections must be removed and notice given the recorder before any reduction will be made in the charges for water.

Section 5, Should the owner or occupant of any premises desire any additional taps or faucets, or wish the use of water for any purpose not stated in the original application a new application must be made to the recorder.

Section 6, Hereafter all service pipes must be so arranged that the supply to each house or premises may be controlled by a separate stop cock within or near the street curb line, or at the main.

Section 7, Water will not be furnished for building purposes except upon satisfactory estimates from the person or architect in charge of the work as to the amount of water required, and must be paid for in advance.

Section 8, Inside of all basements or at some convenient place at or near the place where the service pipes enter the building a drain or waste cock shall be placed so that the water can be drained from the pipes in the building during freezing weather, said stop and waste cocks must be well protected from frost. Water must not be allowed to run to waste, or kept running at any time longer than is necessary for the proper use thereof, when unnecessary waste of water is found to exist the owner of the premises will be notified of the fact, and if such waste continues thereafter, or is repeated the water will be shut off at the main, when the water has been so shut off a charge of \$1.00 will be charged for turning it on again.

Section 9, The service pipes within the premises and throught there entire length to the street cock must be kept in good repair by the owner or occupant, if leaks occur in any service pipes the owner or occupant of the premises must immediately repair the same, and whenever it becomes necessary in the street or walks in order to repair a pipe, the excavation must be repaired without delay.

Section 10, No person will be allowed to make connections or any alterations in any water pipes or other fixtures connected therewith or to connect pipes when they have been disconnected, or to turn water on or off any premises, except in case of emergency. without the permission of the recorder or water commissioner.

Section 11, All water rates shall be due and payable to the Recorder or water commissioner in advance on the first day of the month, and if not paid on or before the 15th day of the month, the water may be shut off from the premises by the recorder or water commissioner unless good and sufficient reasons are shown why the rates have not been paid, provided that rates may be paid for any number of months in advance, not beyond the current year.

Section 12, It shall be unlawful for any person to attach to or detach from any water main or service pipe or other connection through which water is supplied to water consumers, or to interfere in any manner with such pipes or connections without the consent of the recorder or water commissioner therefor.

Section 13, Whenever any water user shall desire to have his water pipes detached from or attached to the street main, he or she shall notify the Recorder or Water commissioner and it shall be the duty of the recorder or commissioner on payment of the reasonable charge therefor to give his written consent for such attachment or detachment or he shall as soon possible thereafter proceed to make such

or cause to be made such attachments or detachments, provided that all water rates or charges against the applicant be paid.

Section 14, The foregoing rules and regulations contained in this ordinance must be strictly complied with, and the water rates must be paid in accordance with the schedule in section one of this ordinance, employees or officers of the town will not be permitted to make any exceptions to these rules.

Section 15, It shall be the duty of each and every plumber to make a report in writing to the Recorder of all connections, attachments or detachments, or extensions made by him, within three days after the work is finished giving the location of the premises, the name of the owner or occupant, the number of faucets, Bath tubs, Water closets or any other connections.

Section 16, It shall be unlawful for any person to open any stop cocks, faucet, or hose connection, or other fixture so as to allow water to run to waste, and it shall be unlawful for any consumer of water supplied by the town of Stayton to cause or permit water to run to waste or be discharged through pipes or faucets, in any building or on any lot owned or occupied by him or her, in excess of the quantity actually necessary for the purpose for which payment has been made.

Section 17, All taps, faucets, or hose connections shall be immediately closed whenever a general fire alarm is sounded, and shall keep them closed until the fire is out, or until the fire apparatus has returned to the Engine room.

Section 18, Any person violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a Misdemeanor, and on conviction in the Recorder's Court shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$(50.00) Fifty Dollars, or by imprisonment in the town Jail not exceeding Twenty days.

Section 19, That all of Ordinance No 127, passed by the town Council the 1st day of August 1916, and all other ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance be and the same are hereby repealed,

Section 20. Whereas the rates and regulations set forth in this ordinance will effect the entire water system of the Town of Stayton, it is the judgement of this council that this Ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the peace, health, and safety of the town, and that an emergency exists, and that and that this ordinance shall be in full force and effect, from and after its passage by the council and approval by the Mayor.
