## **RESOLUTION NO. 862**

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF STAYTON TO APPLY FOR A BICYCLE AND PEDESTRIAN GRANT FROM THE OREGON DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION TO CONSTRUCT A SEPARATED BICYCLE PEDESTRIAN PATH ON THE NORTH SIDE OF SHAFF ROAD.

WHEREAS, the Oregon Department Transportation (ODOT) is accepting applications for the Bicycle and Pedestrian Grant Program;

WHEREAS, the Stayton Transportation Master Plan, identifies the need for a pedestrian path connecting the Stayton Middle School to Cascade Highway along the north side of Shaff Road;

WHEREAS, the City of Stayton desires to participate in this matching grant program to the greatest extent possible as a resource for implementing the Transportation Master Plan and making improvements to the pedestrian environment and linking the Middle School to the residential neighborhoods north of Fern Ridge Road;

WHEREAS, the Bicycle and Pedestrian grant requires a 10% match from the City of Stayton;

WHEREAS, a requirement of the ODOT grant application process is that the application include an approved resolution from the governing body authorizing the grant application.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City of Stayton, through its City Administrator, shall apply for a Bicycle and Pedestrian Grant from the Oregon Department of Transportation for a grant for the construction of a separated bicycle and pedestrian path along the north side of Shaff Road between the Stayton Middle School and Cascade Highway.

This Resolution shall become effective upon adoption by the Stayton City Council.
