

RESOLUTION NO. 752

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING CHANGES TO THE ADOPTED 2004-05 SWIMMING POOL FUND BUDGET

WHEREAS, the three-year Library, Parks and Pool local option tax levy passed by Stayton voters in 2002 provided \$90,000 to complete three capital improvement projects at the Stayton Family Memorial Pool;

WHEREAS, the current Swimming Pool (Fund 065) budget does not include sufficient funds in the Levy Funded Equipment line item 71210 to complete the on-site chlorination generating project funded by the three-year local option tax;

WHEREAS, the remaining Swimming Pool Levy Funded Equipment Funds were not expended during the 2003-04 budget year and as such were carried over in the Swimming Pool 2004-05 beginning balances;

WHEREAS, there are sufficient funds in the Swimming Pool Contingency line item 95110 to fund the on-site chlorination generating project;

WHEREAS, in order to lawfully spend money, a local government must comply with the requirements of Local Budget Law;

WHEREAS, Oregon Revised Statutes 294.450(3) authorizes a transfer from one existing appropriation category within a fund, to another existing appropriation in the same fund when a resolution is adopted that authorizes this transfer.

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED that the City Council wishes to transfer \$9,300 from the Swimming Pool, Fund 065 contingency line item to the Levy Funded Equipment line item in order to fund the on-site chlorine generating system project; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that line item 065.95110 (Contingency) be decreased by \$9,300 for fiscal year 2004-05; and,

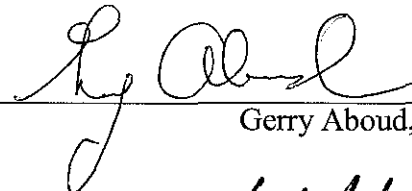
BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that line item 065.71210 (Levy Funded Equipment) be increased by \$9,300 for fiscal year 2004-05.

This Resolution shall become effective upon its adoption by the Stayton City Council.

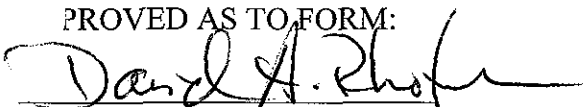
