

RESOLUTION NO. 380

A RESOLUTION REGARDING THE UNITED STATES FOREST SERVICE
WILLAMETTE NATIONAL FOREST PLAN

Whereas, the United States Congress passed the National Forest Management Planning Act to provide communities in and around every national forest with a congressionally mandated voice in determining how their public forest lands should be managed, and

Whereas, the culture, social structure and economy of the City of Stayton is significantly influenced by the outputs of the Willamette National Forest, and

Whereas, the people of the City of Stayton are best served by balanced, multiple-use management providing recreational opportunities, clear flowing streams and a dependable timber harvest, and

Whereas, the U. S. D. A. Forest Service has analyzed nine (9) alternative management scenarios in its draft management plan, and described their comparative impact on the forest and its output for future decades,

Now, Therefore, the City of Stayton Does Hereby Resolve:


1. To request that the United States Forest Service modify its multiple-use management plan for the Willamette National Forest to attain the following goals:

- * Maintain Annual Timber Sale Program At or Above 1987 Level (717 Million Board Feet)
- * Preserve an Adequate Land Base to Support Resource Outputs At or Above Present Levels
- * Maintain Current Land Allocation Balance Between Protected Areas and Multiple Use Forest
- * Enhance Recreation Opportunities . . . Access Roads - Developed Recreation Sites - Trails
- * Recognize and Provide Wildlife/Fisheries Habitat Management and Protection
- * Provide Access for Fire Protection and Pest-Disease Control
- * Continue Current Levels of Forest Revenue to Local Government for Schools/Roads


2. To request that the United States Forest Service consider the impacts the management plan will have on community stability and economic development throughout the Detroit District of the Willamette National Forest.
