

RESOLUTION NUMBER 94

Ordering construction of a curb sidewalk on the East side of First Street between the Stayton Public Grade School and the State Highway Property.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF STAYTON, OREGON:

The Common Council hereby declares it to be necessary and expedient that a new curb sidewalk be constructed within the corporate limits of the City of Stayton, Oregon, upon and along the East side of First Street from the North line of the Stayton Public Grade School property north to 52 feet north of the south line of the State Highway Department property, adjacent to and abutting upon all pieces or parcels of real property located between the North line of the Stayton Public Grade School property north to 52 feet north of the south line of the State Highway Department property on First Street.


The curb sidewalk ordered constructed by this resolution shall be built of Portland Cement Concrete as provided by Ordinance Number 300, and shall be laid down and constructed at the expense of the lot or parcel of land involved. Such curb sidewalk shall be completed within 60 days after the engineering data is available. The recorder shall give notice by mail to the owner of said property requiring such owner to construct the said curb sidewalk as herein ordered; and in case the address of the owner be unknown, the city engineer shall post such notice upon said property. Before constructing such curb sidewalk, the owner of said premises or his agent, shall obtain plans and specifications from the city engineer, which shall prescribe the kind of curb sidewalk to be constructed, the material to be used, and the specifications therefore.

In case the owner of the property shall fail to construct the curb sidewalk as hereby ordered, and within the time limit above specified, the Common Council shall take steps to bring about the construction of such curb sidewalk and make the cost thereof a lien upon the property involved.
