Dear Stayton City Council members,

In the name of Jesus Christ, I thank you for your service to our community.

I haven't been able to join one of your meetings yet, and already you may have been discussing wireless technology, especially 5G. I would like to start or add to this conversation.

We do not have a wireless technology that is safe. Wired technology is the safer technology, as studies have shown.

Several years ago, I met a man who had worked for Verizon, climbing, starting, and maintaining 3G and 4G cell phone towers. He felt that doing so had baked his brain, and he was disabled, had lost his marriage, and was unable to hold a job for long.

From personal experience, I know that using a conventional cordless landline telephone consistently on my left ear gave me more intense temporary hearing loss, temporary lumps in my face and around my ear, and lingering hearing loss in that ear.

Since those experiences, I use speakerphones, wired earbuds, or wired headsets to speak to people remotely.

When we moved to Oregon in 2009, my family and I chose the Scio and Stayton areas because the local telephone associations had put fiber optic cables in town and in many rural areas.

To this day, I use ethernet cables in my home to connect computers to the internet, and I limit the use of my cell phone. There are other measures I take to block the EMF waves and to mitigate their harmful effects.

Is this inconvenient and not the most aesthetically pleasing? A bit, but I would rather not inflict more of the harmful effects of wireless radiation on myself, my son, or anyone else.

At a city council meeting in the near future, I would like to have 20 minutes to read you a well-written article from Dr. Mercola summarizing what is known and unknown about 5G wireless technology and its effects.

Dr. Sharon Goldberg, a research physician, testified at a Michigan legislative hearing on 5G small cell towers in 2018 about what is known from 3G and 4G:

"Wireless radiation has biological effects. Period. This is no longer a subject for debate when you look at PubMed and the peer-reviewed literature. These effects are seen in all life forms; plants, animals, insects, microbes. In humans we have clear evidence of cancer now; there is no question. We have evidence of DNA damage, cardiomyopathy, which is the precursor of congestive heart failure, neuropsychiatric effects... 5G is an untested application of a technology that we know is harmful; we know it from the science. In academics this is called human subjects research." ~ Dr. Sharon Goldberg, "We Are The Evidence" Medical Advisory Board 15 minute video: <a href="https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=CK0AliMe-KA">https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=CK0AliMe-KA</a>

The telecom company baseline about "technology upgrades" seems to be: if it doesn't kill you instantly, that's good enough to move forward. We in the community are left to suffer the long term negative health effects, for which there are years of evidence, and to be part of experiments we did not sign up for.

In the meantime, I urge us to turn away from wireless technology; to stop replacing older wireless technology with newer versions; and to support wired alternatives, such as fiber optic which is light and copper cables.
