## Joyce Cherry Cresswell

The Stayton Public Library is excited to announce a visit featuring author Joyce Cherry Cresswell on Thursday, September 21, 2017 at 7:00 pm in the E. G. Siegmund Meeting Room. There will be a reception accompanying the event.

Joyce Cherry Cresswell is an armchair historian whose interest in the Civil War began as a teenager with *Gone with the Wind*. Since then, her perceptions of that epic struggle have been refined and



informed by the great American writers, both North and South, who have courageously explored the enigma that is America.

Through this novel, based on letters, diaries and newspaper accounts of the day, she adds her great-

grandmother's story to the mix. Her first novel, *A Great Length of Time*, won the 2017 Oregon Literary Arts Ken Kesey Award for Fiction.

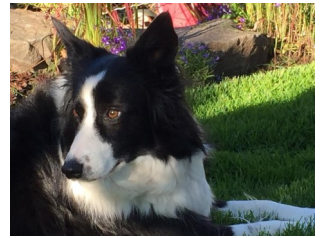


## RANDOM READERS

## COLORING GROUP

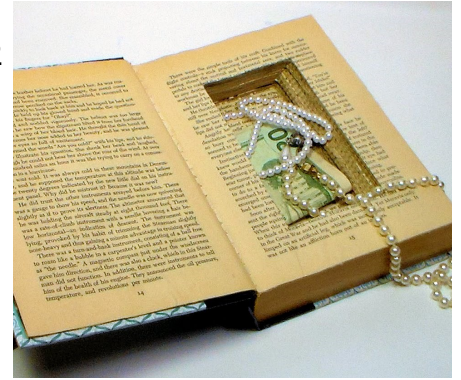

# Art Display—Lake Oswego Reads




During the month of September, the Library will be hosting a travelling art display inspired by the book, *Rise of the Rocket Girls : the women who propelled us, from missiles to the moon to Mars* by Nathalia Holt.

The book was 2017's selection for Lake Oswego Reads. *Rise of the Rocket Girls* is the true story of the women called "computers" who launched America into space. In the 1940s and 50s, when the newly created Jet

Propulsion Laboratory needed quick-thinking mathematicians to calculate velocities and plot trajectories, they didn't turn to male graduates. Rather, they recruited an elite group of young women who, with only pencil, paper, and mathematical prowess, transformed rocket design, helped bring about the first American satellites, and made the exploration of the solar system possible.
