Karen Karbo



Karen Karbo is the author of multiple award-winning novels, memoirs and works of non-fiction. Recently, she was one of 24 authors selected for the inaugural Amtrak Residency. Her next book, *In Praise of Difficult Women* is forthcoming in 2018. Her best-selling "Kick-



Ass Women" series includes Julia Child Rules: Lessons on Savoring Life (2013); How Georgia Became O'Keeffe: Lessons on the Art of Living (2011); The Gospel According to Coco Chanel: Life Lessons from the World's Most Elegant Woman (2009), which was an international best-seller; and *How to Hepburn*: Lessons on Living from Kate the Great (2007),



hailed by the Philadelphia Inquirer as "an exuberant celebration of a great original." Karen grew up in Los Angeles California and lives in Portland, Oregon.
