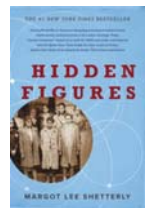
### "Starry" Paint Night

### Book Discussion - "Hidden Figures"

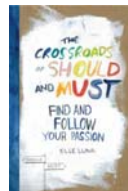
Join us for our monthly book discussion group for adults. This month's book is *Hidden Figures* by Margot Lee Shetterly.
