Changes Coming to Utility Bills and Payment Options

Beginning at the end of May, your City of Stayton utility bill will have a new and improved, streamlined look. While the layout may be different, your utility bill will include all your pertinent account information. Also, a return envelope will be included for your convenience.

Another change coming your way will occur in June. The City will be switching our online utility payment service to Xpress Bill Pay. Customers who currently use Payment Service Network (PSN), will need to set up a new account with Xpress Bill Pay to continue paying your account online. Further information on how to register for Xpress Bill Pay will be included in your next Utility Bill at the end of June.

Got Overdue Book Fines? Join us for Food for Fines!



The Stayton Public Library will be accepting food for fines the week of May 8th through May 13th.

Library patrons can reduce their overdue fines and help hungry neighbors at the same time. Library fines will be reduced by \$1 for each food item contributed. Food cannot be used to reduce fines by more than \$10, or to cover other charges such as lost or damaged items or special fees.

All food items must be commercially processed, factory sealed, and be free of dents, rust, and not expired. All donations will be given to the Stayton Community Food Bank.

Low Interest Home Loans Available



Is your home in need of repair? New furnace, insulation, or safety improvements? The City of Stayton Housing Rehabilitation Program has funding available for home improvements for income-qualified homeowners. Properties must be owner-occupied. The owners must meet the current guidelines as low or moderate income households and have enough equity in their home to meet loan guidelines.

The loans may be used to repair or replace roofing, plumbing, electrical problems, carpet or linoleum, painting, dry-rot, and foundation repairs. The maximum loan amount is \$25,000. No monthly payments are required — the loan is repaid when you sell your home. An interest rate of 4% is charged for the first four years and following that, no additional interest accrues.

Tall Grass? Noxious Weeds? Spring is Here!

It's that time of year... spring has arrived, which means tall grass and noxious weeds are sprouting up and will be on the radar of our Ordinance Enforcement Officer.

Stayton residents are responsible for upkeep of their property, which includes, but is not limited to, mowing grass and removing noxious weeds. General upkeep of your home and yard adds value to your property and overall neighborhood.

When our Ordinance Enforcement Officer identifies a violation, contact will be made with the occupant of the property to ensure they are aware of the issue. If the issue is not remedied within a given period of time, the City will hire a contractor to perform needed services to bring the property into compliance. The property owner will be charged a \$100 fine in addition to the expense of hiring the contractor.
