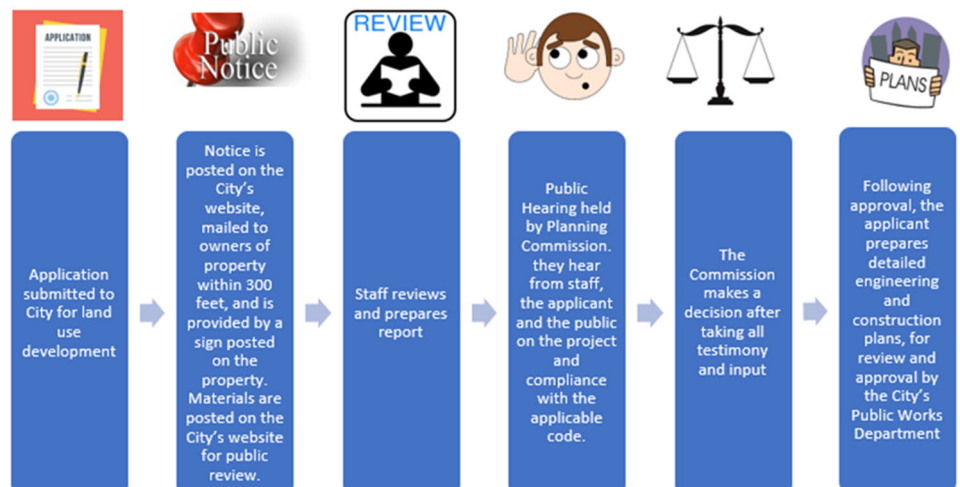
Development on the Horizon

While the City has only seen one new multifamily building constructed since 2000 (a 4-unit townhouse building), there are three projects on the horizon that have been approved in the past year which will bring 190 new units to the City.

The projects are Shaff Square Apartments on Golf Club Road (100 one- and two-bedroom apartments); North Third Avenue apartments, located between the MAPS Credit Union and the Elmcroft Assisted Living facility (72 1-, 2-, and 3-bedroom apartments); 1425 E Santiam Street (18-unit duplex development).

While these projects are approved and will be under construction soon, we want to take this opportunity to share information about the process for reviewing these types of projects and where and how you can provide input.
