Stayton Highlights - Jennifer Siciliano, Planning



Stayton has several departments, each has a specific focus on the City's function. These departments and their staff work to manage the city's development and growth, and work with the people who live in that city to make those changes together. We will highlight one such staff member who works within Stayton's Planning department. Someone who understands the 'urban fabric' and helps plan for the city's future shape, Jennifer Siciliano, Stayton's new Community and Economic Development Director.

The Community and Economic Development Director is a new position title for Stayton, it has similarities to its preceding title, Planning and Development Director. Both consider the proper use of a space, the project's lasting effect on the community, and how it may impact the city on multiple levels. The difference for the new title is the emphasis on bringing and retaining businesses within the city.

"I help others navigate land use and codes, usually for commercial projects or subdivisions [...], I also find and help with grants, both state and federal." A city has numerous codes that work together to prevent problems in the future and it's up to Jennifer to make sure that everything is in order before any tools break ground. Jennifer has spent quite a lot of time as a city planner, originally working in the cities of Rhode Island. In 2022, Jennifer moved from Rhode Island to Oregon with her family.

"Oregon has been an interesting experience. Oregon has more planning regulations [...]. Rhode Island has a very specific process, but not a lot of differences. It's complex, working within a county, but the cities here have more control of what can be in them." Jennifer is learning new municipal codes for the city, taking prior experience, and adapting and growing with her new responsibilities.

Stayton is seeing new development and opportunities every day; Jennifer reviews the plans before anyone even thinks about sending in an application. Jennifer takes into consideration all the codes and city zoning laws, sees the possibilities, and informs those who will be using the space what needs to be done so the application process is quick, up to code, and planned for accordingly.

When asked about inspirations and goals, Jennifer mentions another Urban Planner by the name of Jane Jacobs. Someone whose vision became a fundamental pillar to how urban planning is viewed, understood, and its impact on the community and economics. Jacobs wrote *"City plans must fit the people, not the other way round!"* Jennifer uses this motivation to look for the opportunity within the city limits and see how space can impact the future, the properties around it, and how others can enjoy the space.

Stay tuned as continue to explore the City of Stayton's departments and how we all work together to make a better tomorrow.
