

AN ORDINANCE TO PROHIBIT SOLICITORS AND PEDDLERS FROM GOING IN AND UPON PRIVATE RESIDENCES, AND PROVIDING A PENALTY FOR VIOLATION THEREOF.

The Town of Stayton do ordain as follows:

Section 1. The practice of going in and upon private residences in the town of Stayton, Oregon, by solicitors, peddlers, hawkers, itinerant merchants and transient vendors of merchandise, not having been requested or invited so to do by the owner or owners, occupant or occupants of said private residences, for the purpose of soliciting orders for the sale of goods, wares and merchandise, and/or for the purpose of disposing of and/or peddling or hawking the same, is hereby declared to be a nuisance, and punishable as such nuisance as a misdemeanor.

Section 2. The town marshal and police force of the town of Stayton are hereby required and directed to suppress the same, and to abate any such nuisance as is described in the first section of this ordinance.

Section 3. Any person convicted of perpetrating a nuisance as described and prohibited in the first section of this ordinance, upon conviction thereof shall be fined a sum not less than \$25, or not more than \$100, together with costs of proceedings, which said fine may be satisfied, if not paid in cash, by execution against the person of anyone convicted of committing the misdemeanor herein prohibited.
