

ORDINANCE NO. 287

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE VACATION OF A DULY DEDICATED STREET DESCRIBED HEREIN IN THE TOWN OF STAYTON, MARION COUNTY, OREGON.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF STAYTON

Section 1. That Whereas the Common Council of the Town of Stayton did on the 7 day of September, by resolution, propose the vacation of the street hereinafter described and that whereas said resolution did specify and call for a hearing to be held in the City Hall of the Town of Stayton, Marion County, Oregon on the 15 day of October, 1954 at 8:00 P.M. pursuant to said Resolution notices were posted at both ends of the proposed vacation and said notices were published 4 consecutive times in the Stayton Mail, a newspaper of general circulation, published in Stayton, Marion County, Oregon, stating the time, place and date of said hearing.

Whereas, said hearing was held on October 15, 1954, and there were no objections or remonstrances and whereas the Common Council of the Town of Stayton, Marion County, Oregon, directed the City Attorney to prepare and draft an Ordinance vacating the hereinafter described real property.

Section 2. It is hereby declared that the following described real property, a street is hereby vacated, to-wit:

All that portion of Washington Street or County Market Road No. 32 which is South of the Southern boundary of a road 60 feet in width and described in Volume 466, page 688, of the Deed Records of the office of Marion County Deed Records, Marion County, Oregon. Said road to be vacated being in Section 10 T. 9 S. R. 1 W. of the W.M., Marion County, Oregon

ORDINANCE NO. 288

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING SUNDAY AUCTION SALES AND PROVIDING A PENALTY FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF.

THE TOWN OF STAYTON DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The term "auction" shall mean to offer for sale in competitive bidding any articles of property of any kind or nature whatsoever.

Section 2. It shall be unlawful for any person or firm to sell or offer to sell any goods, wares, merchandise or real property within the City of Stayton at auction on Sunday.

Section 3. Any person or firm convicted of a violation of this ordinance shall upon conviction thereof be fined a sum of not less than \$25.00, and/or not more than \$100.00, together with costs of proceedings, which said fine may be satisfied, and if not paid in cash, by execution against the person of anyone convicted of committing the misdemeanor herein prohibited.
