

ORDINANCE NO. 125.

A Bill for an Ordinance granting unto C. E. Taylor, his heirs and assigns, so far as the Town of Stayton is concerned, the right and privilege of placing his electric light office on the three cornered tract of land at the foot of Third Street and adjoining the Stayton Water Power Company's ditch, in consideration of the said C. E. Taylor building concrete piers for the bridge across the ditch at said point, and also a stone retaining wall easterly from the North pier sufficient length to permit logs to pass without interference.

THE TOWN OF STAYTON DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Town of Stayton, Oregon, in consideration of the said C. E. Taylor building substantial concrete piers for the bridge to be constructed at the foot of Third Street, across the Stayton Water Power Company's ditch, and also a stone retaining wall from the North pier easterly up said ditch sufficient length to permit logs to pass without interference, does hereby grant unto the said C. E. Taylor, his heirs and assigns so far as the Town of Stayton is concerned the right and privilege of placing his electric light office on the three cornered tract of land at the foot of Third Street, belonging to the Town of Stayton, C. E. Taylor, H. N. Huntley and Chas. Staab. It being understood that the above permit covers only the equity or interest of said town of Stayton, in and to said tract, and further that said piers shall be of sufficient width to permit the construction of a wagon bridge. The placing of the office shall in no way interfere with the passage over this bridge.
